With respect to internal ratings and their implications for the ex-ante credit risk in bank loan portfolios, most research done so far has focused on examining the general design of banks internal ratings systems and suggesting how specific design choices are likely to affect the eventual functioning of Basel II.

In the internal ratings-based (IRB) approach, a bank may base regulatory capital calculations on its internal rating systems, provided that the internal rating systems meet several minimum requirements .

Banks have used internal credit rating systems for some time and the process often lacks transparency for corporate customers. Under Basel II bank internal credit ratings may be used for calculating the minimum capital a bank has to allocate against each individual loan.
